<p>Test on 10th September</p> <p>The /ow/ sound spelled 'ou.' Found often in the middle of words, sometimes at the beginning and very rarely at the end of words.</p>	<p>Test on 17th September</p> <p>The /u/ sound spelled 'ou.' This digraph is only found in the middle of words.</p>	<p>Test on 24th September</p> <p>The /i/ sound spelled with a 'y'.</p>	<p>Test on 1st October</p> <p>Words with endings that sound like /ze/, as in measure, are always spelled with '-sure'.</p>	<p>Test on 8th October</p> <p>Words with endings that sound like /ch/ is often spelt 'ture' unless the root word ends in (t)ch.</p>	<p>Test on 15th October</p> <p>Challenge words (statutory words from Y3/4 spelling list)</p>	<p>Test on 22nd October</p> <p>Words with the prefix 're-' 're-' means 'again' or 'back'.</p>
