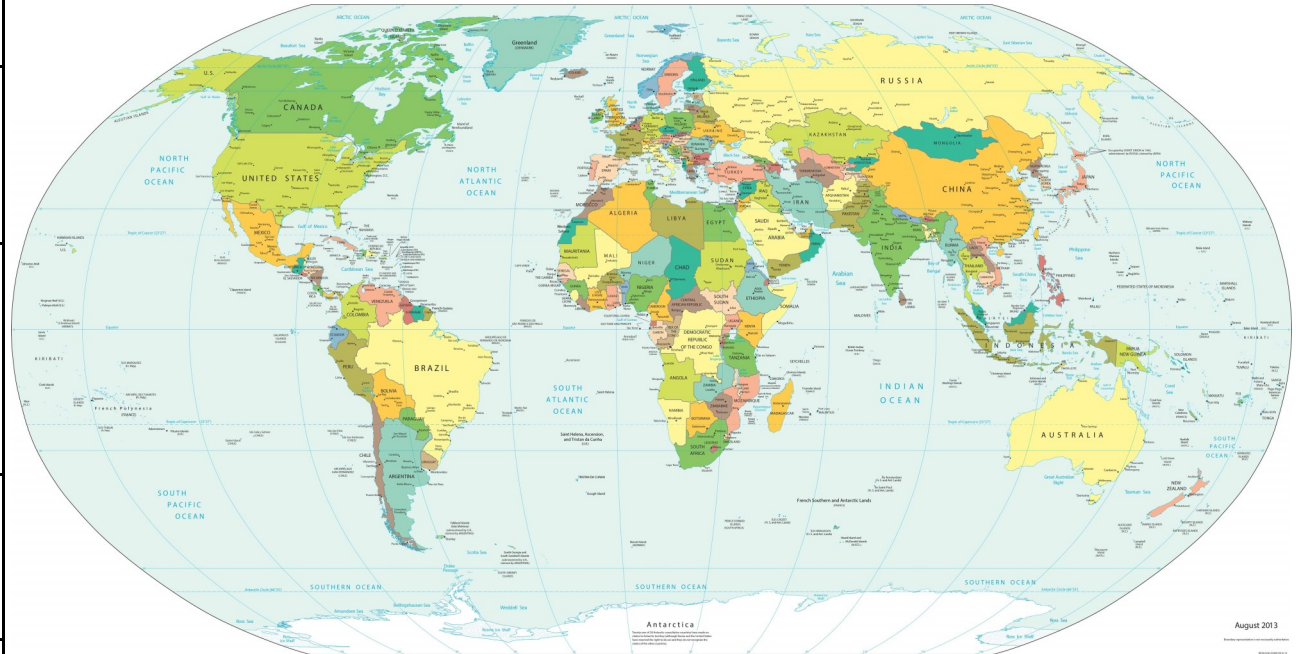


Scrumdiddlyumptious! — Year 1/2 Knowledge Organiser (Spring 1)



Key Vocabulary	
High street	A High street usually have a range of shops along one busy road. Shops could sell other things as well as food. You may find specialist food shops such as butchers, cafes and delicatessen.
Supermarket	There's lots of different supermarkets. I'm sure you could name a few. People visit supermarkets to purchase all the food they need for the whole week.
Market	A market has stalls. One person will own that stall and sells food or other items that they sometimes make themselves. Market days can be busy. If you are lucky, the market trader might give you a sample of what they are selling!
Arable farm	An arable farm grows crops; such as: wheat, vegetables and oil seed rape. Have you ever visited a farm that grew crops? What were they growing?
Pastoral farm	A pastoral farm raise animals for meat, wool or dairy products. What animals have you seen on a farm? Why do you think the farmer keeps them?
Mixed farm	A mixed farm does a mixture of arable and pastoral farming.
Dairy	Dairy foods are products made from milk. Cheese, yoghurt and cream are made from milk. Can you think of anything else that's a dairy product?
